



Background

- BroadReach Healthcare supports the South African National Department of Health in four districts across two provinces with high HIV prevalence
- A component of this support is to strengthen Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission (PMTCT) data reporting to address the **data quality issues** to correctly reflect program performance
- **PMTCT_STAT** refers to the number of pregnant women with known HIV status at antenatal care
- Data quality issues reviewed across 316 facilities using de-identified TIER.Net extracts showed 84% PMTCT_STAT coverage in Sept 2018

PMTCT data quality issues identified:

- Incorrect **reporting**
- Incomplete **recording** of patient information
- Inconsistent capturing of patient details


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
BroadReach Healthcare supports **316** facilities

Interventions

- Validated **patient file information** against national patient management data base (TIER.Net)
- **Mentored** Health Care Workers involved in PMTCT program on antenatal data element definitions
- Reviewed and consolidated **PMTCT data** between different facility registers
- Aligned recording of monthly facility summary data documents to update Web DHIS
- **Monthly analysis** of PMTCT data recorded on Web DHIS
- Assigned accountability to data and clinical teams
